

GUIDE TO THE REQUIREMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE ARTICLES OF THE BSU "BANBER" PERIODICAL

1. Terms for Submitting an Article

The scientific periodical "Banber" of Brusov State University (BSU) publishes articles that correspond to the vocational directions of the periodical ("Linguistics and Philology", "Pedagogy and Social Sciences"), have a scientific novelty and topicality. The periodical is published four times a year (two issues for each research field) in printed and electronic formats.

Authors without a degree submit the supervisor's review to the editorial board of the periodical (or that of a specialist in the given field) or the signed recommendation on the part of the chair.

Before submitting an article, authors are to get acquainted with [the rules of the periodical publishing ethics](#).

The originals of articles, the application and the information leaflet, already filled in and signed, are sent to the "Banber" e-mail address publishing@bryusov.am; the originals are to be submitted in hard copy as well.

2. Principles and Structure of Article Design

The article can be submitted in Armenian, Russian, English, and, in certain cases, in another language. The name(s) of the article author(s), the title, the keywords are given in 12 pt font, with capital letters and in bold.

The title of the article must not be long (at most 10 words); it is supposed to reflect the main content of the article, the subject of the research.

The UDC (Universal Decimal Classification Code) and the DOI (Digital Identification Number) of each article is installed by the editorial staff before the article is published.

The article must consist of separate sections, with appropriate subtitles:

Abstract

The abstract is an independent text; it must reflect the key content of the article in which mere copy of the title and references to the article are unacceptable. The key provisions of the research, and main result (s) are briefly presented (at most 200 words) in the abstract. In the abstract there must be no references, abbreviations must be deciphered.

Keywords Keywords must be separated with commas (5-7 words, in case of word combinations - 3 words at most). Sentences are not allowed. Brackets, parentheses and other symbols should be avoided.

Introduction

The introduction is supposed to reveal the problems of the study, substantiate the topicality and novelty of the subject, theoretical and practical / applied significance, the research method(s), outline the aim and research provisions of the subject under study.

Subtitles:

The text of the article is supposed to have sections with their subtitles which present the separate provisions and problems of the research.

Conclusion

The conclusion is to present the general description of the research, in which the main conclusion (s) of the research will be clearly formulated.

List of literature

References in the literature list must be relevant to the content of the article and the subject of the study. After the list of literature in the REFERENCES section, in alphabetical order, in the Latin transliteration version (you can use the site www.translit.ru for transliteration) you have to give the non-Latin literature used in the article, then in the 1st brackets [...] give the translated version in the 2nd brackets (...) Indicate the language of the original, e.g.

P. Bediryan, Jamanakacic hayereni dardzvacabanutyun, Yrevan, 1973, p.213, [Bediryan P. Phraseology of Modern Armenian, Yerevan, 1973, p. 216], (In Armenian).

A.D. Reichstein, Sopostavitelni analiz nemeckoi I ruskoj frazeologii, Moskva, 1980. [Reichstein A.D., Comparative analysis of German and Russian phraseology. Moscow, 1980] (In Russian)

Summaries In Foreign Languages

Summaries in two languages other than the language of the article are given at the end of the article and must not exceed 300 words. The name (s), surname (s) of the author (s) of the article, the title, the keywords are given in 12 pt. font, with capital letters and in bold.

Information about the author:

At the end of the article information about author is given in three languages (Armenian, Russian, English), and comprises the author's name, surname, academic degree, scientific title, position, full name of the scientific or educational organization (institute, university, chair, faculty, department, etc.), e-mail address, (the phone number is mentioned in the electronic letter to keep in touch with the author).

3. Technical Requirements for the Article .

- ✓ For Armenian, Russian and English -the font is GHEA Grapalat,
- ✓ the main font-size: 10,
- ✓ line space: 1.15,

- ✓ article size: not less than 0.5 and not more than 1,0, minimum 8, maximum 16 pages, abstracts inclusive
- ✓ page dimensions: 160x230 mm
- ✓ page margins: top 2 cm, bottom 2.5 cm, left 2 cm, right 2 cm (without any stylistic design),
- ✓ width of graphs and tables up to 125 mm
- ✓ beginning of the paragraph from a depth of 1 cm
- ✓ all pages must be numbered
- ✓ there mustn't be double spaces and syllable division in the text
- ✓ tables must be numbered and titled, in a vertical position (Portrait),
- ✓ charts, diagrams, photographs must be of high quality; they must meet the quality requirements of the print; they must be numbered in the in-text link; In the internal reference, they should be numbered; in case of reproduction from another source, the short data of the source should be mentioned, whereas in the list of literature, the complete data must be given.
- ✓ Text underlining tools such as italics and bold can be used to emphasize the key terms of the main idea and conclusion in the text.
- ✓ When using abbreviations for the first time, one must give the full name (in parentheses in the text).
- ✓ Centuries are written in Roman numerals. Numerals up to 10 are written in letters and the next ones are written in Arabic numerals.

The editorial staff of the periodical "Banber" is guided by the Harvard APA (American Psychological Association) style of making internationally recognized references in the humanities and social sciences, *see* link system guide: <https://www.mendeley.com/guides/apa-citation-guide>) or download [here](#):
- ✓ In-text citations must correspond to the list of references. The in-text citation is given in parentheses (in the source language) and includes the author's surname and the date of publication, in some cases - source pages as well.

If the author's name is given in the sentence, only the source date is given in parentheses. *For example, Hakobyan (1980) believes that the study was conducted in the early Middle Ages.*

Footnotes and comments made by the author of the article, can be given in the footnotes of the main text.
